CENTRAL AMERICAN VILLAGE MAYAGÜEZ, PUERTO RICO



The Central American Village is a housing complex of 386 apartment units each with three (3) bedrooms and two (2) bathrooms. The complex will be constructed by Picerne, a private company, in an agreement with the government. The government will donate the land and Picerne will construct the village. It will house athletes and trainers during the XXI Central American and Caribbean Sports Games. After the Games, this housing complex will be administered by a private company that will rent these units to people with low to moderate income.

The Central American Village is located on road 102 in Mayagüez and it will house approximately between 3,800 to 4,000 people during the peak time of the competition.

HOW TO GET THERE

North Route – Road 22 west from San Juan connecting to road #2 from Arecibo to the junction of road 102 in Mayagüez.

South Route – Road 52 south from San Juan connecting to road #2 from Ponce to the junction of road 102 in Mayagüez.

This complex will have an International Area, a Main Square with Flags, a Hospital, Meeting Rooms, a Transportation Center, Information Center, and a Club House.



The master calendar for the construction of the village is as follows:

April 2007	Beginning of land preparation
June 2007	Beginning of residential construction
June 2008	Beginning of international zone
Nov. 2009	Culmination of international zone
Feb. 2010	Culmination of residential zone

CENTRAL AMERICAN AND CARIBBEAN SPORTS ORGANIZATION

During November, 2008 the Executive Committee of the Organization will visit our city with their three Commissions: Medical, Infrastructure, and Technical. This is a routine visit to observe the development of the construction works at the different venues, in order to see the lapse of time in relation to the inauguration of the Games. This will be the fourth visit to Mayagüez, and at the moment, according to the reports received, all is proceeding as programmed. To the 1st of July of 2008, there are 747 days remaining for the beginning of the Games.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE CENTRAL AMERICAN AND CARIBBEAN SPORTS GAMES

DID YOU KNOW

- ✚ The shooter **Bernardo Tobar**, from Colombia, won 20 medals during his competitive years, 9 of them were Gold, 11 Silver, and 9 Bronze.
- ✚ Mexican **José R. Álvarez**, also a shooter, won a total of 24 medals, 3 Gold, 11 Silver, and 10 Bronze.
- ✚ Mexico is the only country to participate in all of the 20 Games held. Puerto Rico and Guatemala follow with nineteen (19) participations.
- ✚ Athletics, Basketball, Swimming, and Shooting are the only sports celebrated in all the twenty (20) Games.
- ✚ The only sports that were held at least once in the Games and that are not now in the Sports Statutes are golf and frontennis. Golf was an official sport from the 1938 to the 1959 Games, and frontennis was held in 1938 and 1946.
- ✚ For the Mayagüez 2010 Games, of the thirty seven (37) games stated by CACSO, thirty (30) of them are going to be held at Puerto Rico and the other seven (7) in the sub-venue of Guadalajara, México.
- ✚ Equestrian was not celebrated during a period of six (6) Games; from 1962 in Jamaica to 1982 in Cuba.

JUDGES AND OFFICIALS TRAINING PROGRAM

We started the preparation of the local Judges and Officials that will be working during the Games in coordination with the different Sports Federations that are included in the Sports Program of the XXI Central American and Caribbean Sports Games.

The training started with the participation of thirty seven (37) athletics judges that will work on the Games during the summer of 2010 in Mayagüez. The Basic Training was held the 21st and 22nd of June, 2010 in the Mayagüez Campus of the UPR. Prof. Cándido Vélez, who will be in charge of Athletics in Mayagüez 2010, along with other six (6) instructors offered the seminar. Also present were Freddie Vargas, Jamil Justiniano, Luis Ramos, Luis Figueroa, Luis Palacio, and Néstor Berríos. Practical and theoretical sessions were offered during these two days regarding the functions of the judges in different athletics events and disciplines. Prof. Vélez stated that this is the beginning of the training process for judges. During 2009 there will be additional workshops.
