## Introduction

The Organizing Committee for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 presents this *Athletes Qualification Manual* to offer the National Olympic Committees (NOC) and members of the Pan American Sports Organization (PASO), an instrument to assess the qualification criteria that was established by the Pan American Confederations and by the International Federations in order to participate in this great Continental event.

This document will be considered the only reference for the NOCs to retrieve the updated information related to the athletes' qualification systems for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

Presently, most sports have an approved qualification system. Some sports systems are waiting to be approved and some other sports do not have a qualification system yet. In those cases, PASO and The National Olympic Committees will receive the update as soon as the Pan American Confederations and the International Federations confirm the information.

All changes and updates made by the Pan American Confederations and the International Federations to this Athletes Qualification Manual will be informed immediately to PASO and the National Olympic Committees.

The approved Qualification period is from January 1, 2010 to September 4, 2011.

This manual also includes up-to-date information related to the sports that will qualify athletes in Guadalajara 2011 for the **London 2012 Olympic Games**.

# IV. Qualification Systems



# 1. Aquatics

## 1.1 Diving

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Aquatics Federation is a member of the International Swimming Federation (FINA, *Fédération Internationale de Natation*) and ASUA may enter athletes in the Diving competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of SIXTY (60) athletes in the Diving competition.

The NOCs may only send competitors who have qualified through the system established by FINA and ASUA to participate in the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### c) Qualification System

- As the host country, Mexico will automatically qualify to compete in all categories in the Diving competition for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.
- No later than July 1, 2011, each NOC must submit to ASUA a list with the names of the proposed divers to be registered for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.
- If the number of proposed divers exceeds the quota of SIXTY (60), ASUA will determine the qualified divers for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 according to the FINA World Ranking and will communicate this to the NOCs, the PASO Technical Commission and the Organizing Committee no later than July 13, 2011 so that the Nominal and Numerical Entry processes can be completed according to the Pan American Games regulation.
- Each NOC may enter a maximum of eight (8) divers, four (4) men and four (4) women, if entering a team in synchronized diving. NOCs not entering athletes in synchronized diving will be allowed to enter a maximum of six (6) athletes, three (3) men and three (3) women.
- Each NOC may enter a maximum of two (2) divers per individual event and one (1) team per synchronized event.

### d) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by ASUA on May 26, 2010.

### e) London 2012 Olympic Qualification

At the meeting of the FINA Bureau held on July 28, 2009, the FINA Bureau approved that the Continental Champion (from the 2011 Pan American Games) in the Individual Events of 3m Springboard and 10m Platform shall earn an Olympic Games position for their respective federations, with official entries to be confirmed by the respective NOCs.



## 1.2 Swimming

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Aquatics Federation is a member of the International Swimming Federation (FINA, *Fédération Internationale de Natation*) and ASUA may enter athletes in the Swimming competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota approved by PASO, the total number of athletes in the Swimming competition shall not exceed TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY SIX (256).

There will be a maximum of twenty six (26) male and twenty six (26) female competitors per country.

The NOCs may only send competitors who have qualified through the system established by FINA and ASUA to the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### c) Qualification System

- As the host country, Mexico will automatically qualify with twenty six (26) male and twenty six (26) female competitors.
- Each NOC may enter those swimmers who have met the qualifying time standards established by ASUA for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.
- This minimum standard of performance shall be achieved at an official competition recognized by the respective National Federation, from January 1, 2010 to July 31, 2011.
- Each NOC shall be guaranteed an entry of one (1) male and one (1) female swimmer for one event without having a qualifying time for that event.
- NOCs may enter one (1) swimmer per event when the swimmer attains a “B” standard. NOCs may enter two (2) swimmers per event when both swimmers attain the “A” standard.
- **Relays.** NOCs may enter one (1) team in each relay event. Each country shall be allowed a maximum of two (2) “relay only” swimmers, that is, a country may have only two (2) swimmers who will swim in relay only event. All the other relay participants must be entered in the individual events.

#### d) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by ASUA on May 10, 2009.

#### e) London 2012 Olympic Qualification

The Swimming competition during the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 is considered a Qualification Competition for the 2012 London Olympic Games. The athletes that achieve the Minimum Qualifying Time required by FINA will qualify for the 2012 London Olympic Games.



## 1.3 Open Water Swimming

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO whose National Aquatics Federation is a member of the International Swimming Federation (FINA, *Fédération Internationale de Natation*) and ASUA may enter athletes in the Open Water Swimming competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of competitors

Athletes competing in the Open Water Swimming events must be at least fourteen (14) years old at the time of the competition.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota approved by PASO, there will be a maximum of THIRTY TWO (32) swimmers participating in the Open Water Swimming event: sixteen (16) men and sixteen (16) women.

The NOCs may only include competitors who have qualified through the system established by FINA and ASUA for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### d) Qualification System

## 1.4 Synchronized Swimming

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Aquatics Federation is a member of the International Swimming Federation (FINA, *Fédération Internationale de Natation*) and ASUA may enter athletes in the Synchronized Swimming competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of Competitors

Competitors must be at least fourteen (14) years old on December 31, 2011.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of EIGHTY (80) competitors.

- Eight (8) teams with a maximum entry of nine (9) competitors each.
- Twelve (12) duets no alternates

The NOCs may only register competitors who have qualified through the system established by FINA and ASUA for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### d) Qualification System

- The host country will be a representative for its zone in each event.
- If any qualifying country fails to confirm its participation by **July 14, 2011**, alternate federations, in qualifying order, will be approached to replace them.
- As the host country, Mexico is automatically qualified in all categories of the Synchronized Swimming competition

### e) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by ASUA on May 10, 2009.

### f) 2012 London Olympic Qualification

Synchronized Swimming at the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 is considered a qualification competition for the 2012 London Olympic Games. During the Synchronized Swimming, One (1) duet and one (1) team (Gold Medalists) will qualify for the Olympics Games.



## 1.5 Water Polo

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Aquatics Federation is a member of the International Swimming Federation (FINA, *Fédération Internationale de Natation*) and ASUA may enter athletes in the Water Polo competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, the Water Polo competition will have a maximum of TWO HUNDRED AND EIGHT (208) athletes, as follows:

- Men's competition: eight (8) teams x thirteen (13) athletes = one hundred and four (104) male athletes.
- Women's competition: eight (8) teams x thirteen (13) athletes = one hundred and four (104) female athletes.

The NOCs may only enter competitors who have qualified through the system established by FINA and ASUA for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### c) Qualification System

#### Men's Competition:

Eight (8) teams will qualify for the 2011 Pan American Games using the following system:

- Mexico qualifies as host country.
- CONSANAT qualifies three (3) teams: the first three (3) teams placed in the South American Championships, which will be held in Cali, Colombia on March 2010.
- CCCAN qualifies two (2) teams: the first two (2) teams (excluding Mexico) placed in the 2010 Central American and Caribbean Games, to be held from July 17 to August 1 in Mayaguez, Puerto Rico.
- Zone 3 automatically qualifies the United States.
- Zone 4 automatically qualifies Canada.

#### Women's Competition:

Eight (8) teams will qualify for the 2011 Pan American Games using the following system:

- Mexico qualifies as host country.
- CONSANAT qualifies three (3) teams: the first three (3) teams placed in the South American Championships, which will be held in Cali, Colombia on March 2010.
- CCCAN qualifies two (2) teams: the first two (2) teams (excluding Mexico) placed in the 2010 Central American and Caribbean Games, to be held from July 17 to August 1 in Mayaguez, Puerto Rico.
- Zone 3 automatically qualifies the United States.
- Zone 4 automatically qualifies Canada.

### d) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by ASUA on May 6, 2010.



**e) London 2012 Olympic Qualification**

The Gold Medalists in the women's and men's competitions of the 2011 Pan American Games automatically qualifies for the London 2012 Olympic Games.

If the Gold Medalists have previously qualified through FINA competitions, then the next highest placed team at the Pan American Games qualifies for the Olympic Games.

The second, third, and fourth placed teams at the 2011 Pan American Games automatically qualify for the 2012 Olympic Qualification Tournament. If one of these teams has previously qualified for the Olympic Games, then the next highest placed team qualifies for the Olympic Qualification Tournament.

## 2. Archery

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Archery Federation is a member of the International Archery Federation (FITA, *Fédération Internationale de Tir à l'arc*) and the Pan American Archery Confederation (COPARCO, *Confederación Panamericana de Tiro con Arco*) may enter athletes in the Archery competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of SIXTY FOUR (64) competitors, thirty-two (32) men and thirty-two (32) women in the recurve division.

Each NOC may enter a maximum of three (3) competitors per gender provided they have qualified in accordance with COPARCO's requirements.

### c) Qualification System

- Two tournaments will be used to qualify archers for the Pan American Games:
  - ⇒ The first tournament will be the Pan American Championships 2010 (Qualifying Tournament 1 / QT-1) to be held in Guadalajara, Mexico, on Oct 15-21, 2010.
    - 28 places in each gender will be distributed at CQ-1, as follows:
      - The host country of the Pan American Games will win three places (3)
      - The top seven teams in the Olympic Round Team Event will win three places each. (21 places)
      - The top four (4) individual archers from a separate Olympic Round Individual Event, in which only archers from countries which did not qualify their teams can take part (the team event will be shot before the individual round) will win a spot for their country. One country may qualify a maximum of three archers per gender.
  - ⇒ The second tournament (QT – 2) will be held in 2011, as early as necessary to meet the deadline for numerical entry of July 14, 2011. Venue and dates will be decided in the COPARCO Conference to be held in Guadalajara in 2010.
    - If QT -2 is a world ranking event, a separate Olympic Round Competition will be held with those archers eligible to win a place for the Pan American Games. This means that those archers who have already won places for their countries cannot compete there.
    - All countries which have not won three places yet in one gender may enter up to three archers in the separate Round in QT-2.
    - None of the archers who won spots for their country at QT -1 may participate in the separate OR competition for PAG spots in QT -2.
    - The top four (4) archers in the separate OR competition for Pan American Games spots in QT-2 will win places for their country.

### d) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by COPARCO on November 22, 2009.



## 3. Athletics

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Athletics Federation is affiliated to IAAF and PAC may enter competitors in Athletics competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of competitors

- Male athletes competing in the Marathon and in the 50km Race Walk must be at least eighteen (18) years old on December 31, 2011.
- Female athletes competing in the Marathon must be at least eighteen (18) years old on December 31, 2011.
- For other events, competitors must be at least sixteen (16) years old on December 31, 2011.

### c) Maximum number of competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of SEVEN HUNDRED (**700**) competitors, male and female.

The NOCs may only register competitors who have qualified through the system established by IAAF and PAC for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### d) Qualification System

#### Individual Events

- Each NOC may register one competitor per individual event, even if he/she has not achieved the minimum standard of performance. To register a second competitor, both athletes must have achieved the minimum standard of performance.
- This minimum standard of performance shall be achieved at an official competition recognized by the respective National Federation, from January 1, 2010 until midnight (Guadalajara local time), Sunday **September 4, 2011**.
- As the host country, Mexico will automatically qualify for all events in the Athletics Competition at the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011, with two (2) athletes per event.
- If the qualified athletes exceed the quota of SEVEN HUNDRED (700), PAC will determine which athletes can participate in order to adjust to the quota and will communicate its decision to the NOCs, PASO Technical Commission and the Organizing Committee no later than **September 10, 2011** so that the Entry by name processes may be complete according to the Pan American Games Regulation.

**f) 2012 London Olympic Qualification**

The Athletics competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will serve as an opportunity for athletes to meet the IAAF qualifying standards for the London 2012 Olympic Games.



## 4. Badminton

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Badminton Federation is a member of BWF and PABC may enter athletes in the Badminton competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of EIGHTY EIGHT (88) competitors, forty-four (44) men and forty-four (44) women.

Each NOC may register a maximum of four (4) men and four (4) women, provided that he/she has qualified in accordance with the IBF and PABC requirements.

If at the end of the numerical entry period the total number of participants is above the upper limit established by PASO, forty-four (44) men and forty-four (44) women, PABC will determine, no later than July 31, 2011, a maximum quota for each country as well as the total number of athletes who will be allowed to participate.

Each NOC may register a maximum of three (3) players for the singles events and two (2) couples for the doubles events.

Each NOC that is an associated member of IBF and PABC will have the right to participate with a minimum of one (1) player in the Badminton competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### c) Qualification System

- The PABC Executive Committee has approved the following procedure for the allocation of spots among PABC affiliated members for the Badminton competitions in the XVI Pan American Games:

- Country ranking is determined by adding up the points of the highest ranked player/team from each country in the women's singles, women's doubles, men's singles, men's doubles, and mixed doubles, (a maximum total from the five rankings) using the May 27, 2011 BWF World Ranking. The higher the number of total points, the higher the country ranking.
- The allocation is by country not by individual athlete. Each NOC can choose its own procedure to select its competitor(s) for the Badminton competition. To be entered, each competitor must also be eligible to participate in the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.
- Depending on the number of countries that actually enter players in the XVI Pan American Games, PABC has the right to adjust the participation levels up (where there are less than forty-four (44) entries per gender in the Initial Allocation) or down (where there are more than forty-four (44) entries per gender in the Initial Allocation) to reach the athlete quota, that is, forty-four (44) men and forty-four (44) women.
- Each National Badminton Federation shall confirm their interest in taking the allocated slots to PABC by **June 15, 2011**. In case the quota of forty-four (44) men and forty-four (44) women is not reached through the Initial Allocation, additional slots will be allocated as follows: Beginning with the 4th ranked country, having three (3) or less entries, each country, in rank order, will be allowed to enter one (1) additional man and/or woman until the quota is fulfilled or all countries have been offered an additional slot, whichever comes first. If the quota is still not reached, then the process will repeat itself until the quota is complete, with a limit of four (4) men and four (4) women entries for each country.

#### **d) Qualification System Approval**

The qualification system was revised and approved by PABC on November 4, 2009



## 5. Baseball

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Baseball Federation is a member of IBAF and Pan American Baseball Confederation (COPABE, *Confederación Panamericana de Beisbol*), may enter athletes in the Baseball competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of ONE HUNDRED AND SIXTY (**160**) competitors, eight (8) teams with twenty (20) players each.

Each NOC may enter a maximum of one (1) team with twenty (20) competitors provided they have qualified in accordance with the IBAF and COPABE requirements.

### c) Qualification System

- The top seven (7) countries in the Pan American Senior Tournament 2010 will qualify for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011. The tournament will be held in San Juan, Puerto Rico on October 1–10, 2010.
- As the host country, Mexico automatically qualifies with one (1) team.

### d) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by COPABE on November 4, 2009.



## 6. Basketball

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Basketball Federation is a member of FIBA Americas may enter athletes in the Basketball competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of ONE HUNDRED AND NINETY TWO (**192**) athletes, including ninety six (96) male players in eight (8) teams with twelve(12) players each and ninety six (96) female players in eight (8) teams with twelve (12) players each.

Each NOC may enter one (1) team in each event provided they have qualified in accordance with the FIBA Americas requirements.

### c) Qualification System

The NOC team qualifications will take place through regional tournaments, under the following considerations:

- The United States and Canada are automatically qualified for North America, as well as Mexico as the host country, in both events of the Basketball competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.
- The other five (5) female and five (5) male teams will qualify according to the following chart:

## 7. Basque Pelota

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Basque Pelota Federation is a member of The International Federation of Basque Pelota (FIPV, *Federación Internacional de Pelota Vasca*) and the Pan American Basque Pelota Confederation (CPPV, *Confederación Panamericana de Pelota Vasca*), may enter athletes in the Basque Pelota competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of ONE HUNDRED (100) competitors including eighty (80) men and twenty (20) women.

### c) Modalities and specialities

### d) Qualification System

The qualification to the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will be according to the *XVI World Championship all categories* that will be held in the city of Pau, France from October 1-10, 2010. It was established that the first five (5) placed American countries participating in that Championship will qualify, with the exception the event Paleta with rubber pelota in 30 metre-Fronton for which 10 countries qualify.

There will be only two (2) registered players per event, except on Mano Individual which will have one (1).

Reserves are not allowed.

### e) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by CPPV on May 7, 2010.



## 8. Bowling

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Bowling Federation is a member of the International Bowling Federation (FIQ, Fédération Internationale des Quilleurs) and WTBA American Zone - PABCON may enter athletes in the Bowling competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of competitors

Competitors must be at least fifteen (15) years old on the date of the first day of competition.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of SIXTY FOUR (64) competitors: thirty-two (32) Men and thirty-two (32) Women.

Each NOC may enter a maximum of two (2) Men and two (2) Women, provided they have qualified in accordance with the FIQ and PABCON requirements.

## 9. Boxing

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Boxing Federation is a member of the International Boxing Association (AIBA, *Association Internationale de Boxe Amateur*) and AMBC may enter athletes in the Boxing competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of competitors

Competitors must be between seventeen (17) years old (minimum age) and thirty-four (34) years old (maximum age) on the first day of competition.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY FIVE (125) competitors: one hundred and four (104) male and twenty one (21) female.

Each NOC may enter a maximum of one (1) boxer in each weight category provided he/she has qualified in accordance with the AIBA and AMBC Rules.

### d) Qualification System

As the host country, Mexico will automatically qualify with one athlete in each of the three (3) women's weight categories and ten (10) men's weight categories of the Boxing competition in the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

The athlete's qualification will be defined during three (3) qualifying tournaments held on March, April and May 2010. Dates and places will be defined by AMBC and will communicate them to NOCs by AMBC and COPAG accordingly.

The distribution criteria for the number of slots per weight category in each qualifying Tournament will be as follows:

- In the categories where four (4) places appear, the Gold, Silver and the two Bronze medalists will qualify.
- In the categories where three (3) places appear, the Gold, Silver and one of the Bronze medalists (the one who lost to the champion on the Semi-final) will qualify.
- In the categories where only two places appear, only the winners of the Gold and Silver medals will qualify.

# 10. Canoeing

## 10.1 Canoe Slalom

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Canoe Federation is a member of ICF and Pan American Canoe Confederation (COPAC, *Confederación Panamericana de Canoas*) may enter athletes in the Canoe Slalom competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of FORTY (40) competitors (female and male).

The NOCs may only send to the Pan American Games competitors who have qualified through the system established by the ICF and COPAC.

### c) Qualification System

- The right to participate in the Pan American Games Canoe Slalom competition is earned at one qualification competition, designated by COPAC to be held in Unión de Tula, Mexico, from October 16 to 17, 2010, and is allocated to boats, not to athletes.
- The NOC which earned the right of participation in the Pan American Games Canoe Slalom competition must inform the COPAC in writing the number of athletes that will participate in the Pan American Games as well as any qualified boats that will not participate in the Pan American Games on Wednesday, June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011.

### Qualification

- NOCs may qualify boats in all events, with a maximum number of one boat per event.

- A NOC not qualified in an event may participate in this event provided the competitor(s) has (have) been entered in a different event qualified by this NOC.

#### **Reallocation of Unused Quota Positions**

- In the event that a NOC does not enter one of its qualified boats in the Pan American Games, or if the number of athlete positions allocated does not reach 40, the allocation of the remaining quota places will be placed under the supervision of the COPAC Secretary General and the COPAC Canoe Slalom Chairman, and be allocated as follows:
  - In case of no fulfillment of the forty athletes quotas, the unused quotas will be obtained by K1W, K1M and C1M boats, with repetition of this order until all unused quotas are fulfilled or there are no K1W, K1M or C1M boats left to obtain quotas. In case of still no fulfillment of the quotas, the unused quotas will go to C2M boats until there are, at least, two (2) quotas left or there are no more C2M boats left. The unused quotas at any time may be fulfilled only by countries that have not yet obtained a quota in the respective event.
  - The placement of unused quotas will follow the order of alternant preference between K1W, K1M and C1M, then C2M only at the end.
  - According to the Regulations in force, even if the host country of the XVI Pan American Games does not qualify in K1M, C1M and K1W events, it will be guaranteed one of the quota places, and, consequently the number of remaining quota places for other countries will be reduced in that specific event.
  - At the very end unused quotas in Canoe Slalom will be used in Canoe Sprint.

#### **d) Qualification System Approval**

The qualification system was revised and approved by COPAC on May 31, 2010.

#### **e) 2012 London Olympic Qualification**

First place per each event in the Canoe Slalom competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011, will qualify for the London 2012 Olympic Games, according ICF criteria.



## 10.2 Canoe Sprint

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Canoe Federation is a member of ICF and Pan American Canoe Confederation (COPAC, *Confederación Panamericana de Canoas*) may enter athletes in the Canoe Sprint competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY (120) competitors (female and male).

### c) Qualification System

- The first 5 (five) single boats (K1 M, C1 M, K1 W) in the events of 1000m, 500 and 200m that cross the finish line of the 2010 Canoe Sprint Pan American Championships to be held in Mexico, D.F., on October, 2010, will qualify for the XVI Pan American Games.
- In the crew boats K2, K4, M & W, and in C2, 1000m, 500m and 200m, the first 5 (five) finishers in each event of the 2010 Canoe Sprint Pan American Championships to be held in Mexico, D.F., on October, 2010, will qualify for the XVI Pan American Games.

Based on these criteria, a total of 110 seats /athletes will be reached.

- 10 (ten) seats will be guaranteed to those NOC's whose new National Federation in order to reach the 120 athletes' quota established by PASO.
- According to the Regulations that are in effect, even if the host country of the XVI Pan American Games does not qualify in some of the 12 competitions, that country will be guaranteed one of the quota places, and, consequently the number of remaining quota places for other countries will be reduced in that specific discipline, while respecting the limit of 16 athletes per NOC as shown below.
- There is a limit of participation for each NOC of 16 athletes (6 athletes of Kayak men, 6 of Kayak women and 4 of Canoe men).
- After adjusting the participation number of each NOC to 16 eligible athletes, the President of COPAC in coordination with the COPAC Canoe Sprint Committee will reallocate the remaining places to the other NOC's according to their performance.
- At the very end, unused quotas of Canoe Sprint will be used in Canoe Slalom.

### d) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by COPAC on May 30, 2010.



**e) 2012 London Olympic Qualification**

First place in the individual events (K1M 200m, K1M 1000m, K1W 200m, K1W 500m, C1M 200m, C1M 1000m) and in the C2 1000 event in the Canoe Sprint competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011, will qualify for the London 2012 Olympic Games, according ICF criteria.

For the events: K2M 200m, K2M 1000m and K2W 500m it will be necessary to wait for the World Canoe Sprint Championship in order to determine which teams will qualify for the London 2012 Olympic Games. This will be announced by the ICF as soon as the World Championship ends.

The K4M 1,000 and K4W 500 events will not qualify for the London 2012 Olympic Games.



# 11. Cycling

## a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Cycling Federation is a member of International Cycling Union (UCI, *Union Cycliste Internationale*) and Pan American Cycling Confederation (COPACI, Confederación Panamericana de Ciclismo), may enter athletes in the Cycling competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

## b) Age of competitors

Competitors must be at least nineteen (19) years old on December 31, 2011.

## c) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of TWO HUNDRED AND TWENTY (**220**) male and female competitors.

## d) Qualification System

### General principles

- Each athlete who meets the eligibility criteria in a given event qualifies his/her NOC for a quota in the specific event.
- All athletes qualified in one of the Cycling disciplines will have the right to be registered in other event provided the participation limit has not been exceeded per NOC.
- The maximum number of athletes per NOC for the Pan American Games is 24 (14 men and 10 women).
- The host country may register athletes in all events as per the PASO Participation Rules for the Pan American Games i.e. a 24 total (14 men and 10 women).

## 12. Equestrian

### a) Participation

Only those NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Equestrian Federation is a member of the International Equestrian Federation (FEI, *Fédération Equestre Internationale*) may enter athletes in the Equestrian competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of Competitors and Horses

Competitors must be at least eighteen (18) years old in the year of the competition, to be eligible to compete in Eventing and Jumping competitions. In Dressage, competitors must be at least sixteen (16) years old in the year of the competition.

Horses must be at least eight (8) years of age to be eligible to compete in Jumping and seven (7) years of age for Dressage and Eventing, the age being counted from January 1, of the year of birth.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO there will be a maximum of ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTY (130) male and female competitors.

The maximum number of horses at the **same** time in the Equestrian Village shall be ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTY (130).

The NOCs may only register competitors who have qualified through the system established by FEI to the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011

### d) Qualification System

Each NOC may enter teams and individuals in each discipline according to the participation numbers indicated above.

- **Dressage**

Riders and horses must obtain the qualification for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 at events that take place from **January 1, 2010** until **July 10, 2011**.

All rider/horse combinations must have achieved a minimum qualification criteria by the date mentioned above: to have achieved 60% in a FEI Prix St Georges Test 2000 on two different occasions, in a CDI or a National Dressage event.

NFs are required to send to FEI a Certificate of Capability for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 Dressage competitions and a record of results for all riders / horses intending to compete no later than midnight (Switzerland time) on Monday, **July 11, 2011**.

- **Eventing**

Riders and horses may obtain the qualification for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 at events that take place from **January 1, 2010** until **July 10, 2011**. All rider/horse combinations must have achieved the minimum



qualification criteria by the date mentioned above in order to obtain an Eventing Qualifying Result in a CCI 3\*.

NFs are required to send to the FEI a Certificate of Capability for Senior Continental Competitions (XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011) and a record of results for all riders / horses intending to compete no later than midnight (Switzerland time) on Monday, **July 11, 2011**.

- **Jumping**

All riders must have competed in at least one CSI event of any category prior to or in the year of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 until **July 10, 2011**.

NFs are required to send to FEI a Certificate of Capability for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 Jumping competitions and a record of results for all riders / horses intending to compete no later than midnight (Switzerland time) on Monday, **July 11, 2011**.

**e) Qualification System Approval**

The qualification system was revised and approved by FEI on August 9, 2009.

**f) 2012 London Olympic Qualification**

The Equestrian competitions during the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will be a Qualifying Competition for the 2012 London Olympic Games.

During this competition, allocation of places for the Olympic Games will be as follows:

**Eventing: Two (2)** best placed teams from FEI Olympic Groups D (North America) and E (Central/South America) from the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will be directly qualified.

**Eventing Individual(s):** (If a NOC is not represented by a Team): the best placed individual from the FEI Olympic World Ranking list from Group D (North America) and E (Central/South America) & additional individual as per the Ranking list.

**Dressage: Two (2)** best placed teams from FEI Olympic Group D (North America) and E (Central/South America) from the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will be directly qualified.

**Dressage Individual(s):** (If a NOC is not represented by a Team): the best placed individual from the FEI Olympic World Ranking list from Group D (North America) and E (Central/South America) and additional individual as per the Ranking list.

**Jumping: Team Competition:** the 3 best placed teams from the XVI Pan American Games not already qualified will be included.

**Jumping: Individual(s)** (if a NOC is not represented by a Team):

- The NOC of the best placed individual from Olympic Group D (North America) will qualify one (1) rider from the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.
- The NOC of the four best placed individual from Olympic Group E (Central/South America) will qualify four (4) riders from the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.



## 13. Fencing

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Fencing Federation is a member of the International Fencing Federation (FIE, *Fédération Internationale d'Escrime*) and the Pan American Fencing Confederation (CPE, *Confederación Panamericana de Esgrima*), may enter athletes in the Fencing competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY SIX (156) male and female fencers.

Each NOC may enter competitors in all the fencing events provided they have qualified in accordance with the FIE and CPE requirements.

### c) Qualification System

#### Teams

There will be a maximum of eight (8) teams per category and gender as follows:

- The top seven best placed countries in each team event of the Qualification Tournament to XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011, to be held in San Jose, Costa Rica from August 1 to 3, 2010.
- As the Host Country, Mexico will automatically qualify with one (1) team per category and gender.
- If Mexico is one of the first seven places in any category in the team events of the Qualification Tournament, the eighth (8<sup>o</sup>) placed will qualify for the team event in that category.

#### Individual

There will be a maximum of eighteen (18) fencers per category and gender.

- Sixteen (16) fencers: two (2) fencers from each one of the eight countries qualified in team events.
- The top two (2) best placed fencers per individual events not belonging to the countries qualified in the team events.

## 14. Football

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Football Federation is a member of the International Federation of Association Football (FIFA, *Fédération Internationale de Football Association*), the CONMEBOL (South American Football Confederation) and the CONCACAF (Confederation of North, Central American and Caribbean Association Football), may enter athletes in the Football competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of competitors

Male competitors must be born on or after January 1, 1989. (Sub-22)

The Women's competition is an open-age competition with no age restrictions.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of TWO HUNDRED AND EIGHTY EIGHT (**288**) competitors, eight (8) male teams and eight (8) female teams with eighteen (18) players each.

Each NOC may enter a maximum of one (1) team per event, provided the team has qualified in accordance with the FIFA, CONMEBOL and CONCACAF requirements.

### d) Qualification System

The qualification criteria will be defined by CONMEBOL and CONCACAF.



# 15. Gymnastics

## 15.1 Artistic Gymnastics

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Gymnastics Federation is a member of the International Gymnastics Federation (FIG, *Fédération Internationale de Gymnastique*) and Pan American Gymnastics Union (UPAG, *Unión Panamericana de Gimnasia*) will be entitled to enter athletes in the Artistic Gymnastics competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of Competitors

Men's Artistic Gymnastics: over fifteen (15) years old on 2011.

Women's Artistic Gymnastics: over fourteen (14) years old on 2011.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

There will be a total of ONE HUNDRED FOURTEEN (114) athletes, a maximum of fifty-seven (57) Men and fifty-seven (57) Women competitors.

### d) Qualification System

The qualifying event for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 is the Pan American Cup 2010, to be held in Guadalajara from August 30 to September 5, using the results of Competition I. The qualification applies to the countries and not to the gymnasts, except for the following places:

## 15.2 Rhythmic Gymnastics

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Gymnastics Federation is a member of the International Gymnastics Federation (FIG, *Fédération Internationale de Gymnastique*) and Pan American Gymnastics Union (UPAG, *Unión Panamericana de Gimnasia*) will be entitled to enter athletes in the Rhythmic Gymnastics competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of Competitors

The gymnasts must be at least fourteen (14) years old in 2011.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

There will be a maximum of forty-six (46) rhythmic gymnastics competitors.

- Individuals: sixteen (16) gymnasts
- Groups: thirty (30) gymnasts

### d) Qualification System

The qualifying event for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 is the Pan American Cup 2010, to be held in Guadalajara on November 8-14, using the results of Competition I (qualification per Team, Individual All Around and General Group). The qualification applies to the countries and not to the gymnasts, except for the 13-16 places.

## 15.3 Trampoline

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Gymnastics Federation is a member of the International Gymnastics Federation (FIG, *Fédération Internationale de Gymnastique*) and Pan American Gymnastics Union (UPAG, *Unión Panamericana de Gimnasia*) will be entitled to enter athletes in the Trampoline competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of Competitors

- Men's Trampoline = over seventeen (17) years old in 2011.
- Women's Trampoline = over seventeen (17) years old in 2011.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

There will be a maximum of sixteen (**16**) competitors, eight (8) men's and eight (8) women's trampoline competitors.

### d) Qualification System

The qualifying event for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 is the Pan American Cup 2010, which will be held in Guadalajara on November 8-14, using the results of Competition I. The qualification applies to the countries and not to the Gymnasts, except for the following places:

## 16. Handball

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Handball Federation is a member of IHF and PATHF may enter athletes in the Handball competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of TWO HUNDRED AND FORTY (**240**) athletes: eight (8) men's team and eight (8) women's team with a maximum of fifteen (15) competitors per team.

Each NOC may enter a maximum of one (1) team in each event provided it has qualified in accordance with IHF and PATHF requirements.

### c) Qualification System

Qualification will take place through regional tournaments, taking into consideration that Mexico as the host country is automatically qualified in both events of the Handball competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

**e) London 2012 Olympic Qualification**

The Handball competition during the XVI Pan American Games will be a qualifying Competition for the London 2012 Olympic Games.

The gold medalist team in the men's competition and the Gold Medalist team in the women's competition will qualify for the London 2012 Olympic Games.



# 17. Hockey

## a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Hockey Federation is a member of the International Hockey Federation (FIH, Federación Internacional de Hockey) and PAHF may enter athletes in the Hockey competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

## b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a total of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY SIX (256) athletes, eight (8) male teams and eight (8) female teams with sixteen (16) players each.

Each NOC may enter a maximum of one (1) team in each event provided the teams have qualified in accordance with the FIH and PAHF requirements.

## c) Qualification System

It is recognized that all countries in the Pan American Hockey Federation should have the opportunity to qualify for the Pan American Games through a regional tournament held during the two years immediately preceding the Pan American Games year.

While the VII South American Championships 2010 and the XXI Central American and Caribbean Games 2010 will provide this opportunity for most countries, there is no opportunity for countries from North America (Canada and USA).

Taking the above premise into consideration, the following is the official qualification procedure for the men's and women's Hockey competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011:

1. Host country (Mexico).
2. The first and second placed countries at the VII South American Championships 2010 (Argentina and Chile, men and women).
3. The first and second placed countries at the XXI Central American and Caribbean Games Mayaguez 2010 (as long as a minimum of four countries participate). In case Mexico finishes first or second, then the third placed country will qualify.
4. The next two (2) countries not already qualified under paragraphs 1 - 3 above, based on final rankings at the III Pan American Cup 2009.
5. The eighth country will be selected under paragraph 6 after the conclusion of the XXI Central American and Caribbean Games Mayaguez 2010.
6. Women's Competition  
There will be a playoff for the eighth spot involving the next placed team in the 2009 Pan American Cup, Cuba and possibly Canada.



They will play a three match series against the team that would have qualified as the eighth country based on the 2009 Pan American Cup rankings at the home of that country.

However, in the event that Canada does not qualify under the procedures of paragraph 1 - 4 above, they will also participate in the play off competition. The form, manner and site will be determined by PAHF immediately after the finish of the XXI Central American and Caribbean Games Mayaguez 2010.

All costs for participating in the play off competitions are to be borne by the respective National Associations. The PAHF will be responsible for covering the cost of neutral officials for this competition.

#### Men's Competition

In order to fill the eighth spot in the men's Pan American Games competition, Cuba will play a three match series against the men's country that would have qualified as the eighth country in accordance with Paragraph 4 above at the home of that country.

All costs for participating in the play off competitions are to be borne by the respective National Associations. The PAHF will be responsible for covering the cost of neutral officials for this competition.

#### **Note:**

If there are less than four participants in the XXI Central American and Caribbean Games Mayaguez 2010, only the first place will qualify. However if the first place team is Mexico, then the second placed team will also qualify.

#### **d) Qualification System Approval**

The qualification system was revised and approved by PAHF on May 15, 2010.

## 18. Judo

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Judo Federation is affiliated to IJF and PJC may enter competitors in the Judo competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

In addition, the athlete must be:

- At least the grade of Shodan;
- A current member of a National Federation affiliated to IJF and PJC. This means that all fees and assessments due to the National Federation and to PJC must be paid and current.
- Must have participated in at least two (2) senior events in the past two (2) years.

### b) Age of competitors

Competitors must be at least fifteen (15) years on December 31, 2011.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY (**140**) athletes for the Judo competition.

Each NOC will be allowed to enter a maximum of one athlete per weight category, provided that he/she has qualified according to the PJC qualification system.

### d) Qualification System

#### Scoring events

There will be ten (10) athletes per weight category, including one (1) athlete from Mexico, who as a host country, is automatically qualified in all the weight categories.

The nine (9) athletes with the highest score in each weight category will qualify for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011. If a representative from Mexico is one of the nine places, the 10<sup>th</sup> placed athlete will qualify.

#### e) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by PJC in the Pan American Judo Congress held on April, 2010.

#### f) London 2012 Olympic Qualification

During the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011, the Judo competition will be considered a scoring event for the IJF world ranking. Each participant receives three (3) points. Medalists and those placing shall receive the following additional points:

Gold Medal	20 points
Silver Medal	14 points
Bronze Medals	10 points
Fifth Places	6 points
Seventh Places	3 points



## 19. Karate

### a) Participation

Only NOC's recognized by PASO and whose National Karate Federation is a member of WKF and PKF may enter athletes in the Karate competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of competitors

Competitors must be at least eighteen (18) years old on the first day of competition.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of EIGHTY (80) male and female competitors.

Each NOC will be entitled to enter a maximum of one (1) athlete in any of the weight categories provided he or she has qualified in accordance with the WKF and PKF requirements.

### d) Qualification System

- The NOCs may only send to the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 competitors who have qualified through the system established by WKF and PKF.
- Only one (1) competitor will be qualified per country per category.
- Mexico, as host country of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 is automatically qualified in all categories of the Karate competition. Therefore, Mexico will be entitled to enter ten (10) athletes.
- Qualification is by name.

#### **The qualification process for each of the ten (10) categories will be as follows:**

- Two (2) athletes per category will qualify from the Pan American Championships 2011 to be organized from May 22 to May 29, 2011 in Guadalajara, Mexico, making a total of twenty (20) athletes.
- Two (2) athletes per category qualified from the ODESUR Games Medellin 2010, held in March 2010, making a total of twenty (20) athletes.
- Two (2) athletes per category will qualify from the Karate competition of the CAC Games Mayaguez 2010 to be held on July 23-25, 2010 making a total of twenty (20) athletes.
- One (1) athlete per category from the North American Championships to be held in March 2011, making a total of ten (10) athletes.
- One (1) athlete per category from the host country, Mexico, making a total of ten (10) athletes.

### e) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by PKF on January, 2010.



## 20. Modern Pentathlon

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Modern Pentathlon Federation is a member of International Modern Pentathlon Union (UIPM, *Unión Internacional de Pentatlón Moderno*) and the PAMPC may enter athletes in the Modern Pentathlon competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, the maximum number of athletes who may compete in Modern Pentathlon is FORTY (40), twenty-four (24) men and sixteen (16) women).

A maximum of four (4) athletes, two (2) men and two (2) women, per NOC will be allowed to participate in the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### c) Qualification System

#### Attribution of qualification:

Qualification is attributed to the country. Athletes will qualify by country in the Pan American Championships 2010 which will be held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, from November 19 to 21, 2010.

The twenty-four (24) slots for men and sixteen (16) slots for women will be filled up in the following order:

1. Mexico, as the host country, will be guaranteed two (2) places for the men's competition and two (2) places for the women's competition.
2. One (1) male and one (1) female athlete from each country affiliated to PAMPC.
3. The remaining positions will be assigned to the nations in the order of their second placed athletes at the 2010 Pan American Modern Pentathlon Championships.
4. If there are any remaining slots they will go to the Pan American countries in the order in which they appear in the UIPM World Ranking List, once the requirement referring to the minimum of points has been fulfilled.

### d) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by the PAMPC on January 15, 2010.



**e) London 2012 Olympic Qualification**

The Modern Pentathlon competition during the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will be a qualification Competition for the 2012 London Olympic Games.

Eight (8) athletes, four (4) athletes per gender, will qualify for the London 2012 Olympic Games.

The Olympic qualification system is as follows:

- The best placed athletes of each gender from the NORCECA region and the best placed athletes of each gender from the South American Region will qualify for the London 2012 Olympic Games.
- Two (2) additional slots will be awarded for the London 2012 Olympic Games for each gender. These will be assigned to the two (2) best placed athletes, excluding the two (2) who have already earned their position by being the best from the NORCECA and South American regions.
- It is important to note that only one (1) athlete per nation will be eligible to qualify for the London 2012 Olympic Games, so only the best placed athlete from each nation will be eligible to qualify for the London 2012 Olympic Games at the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.



## 21. Racquetball

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Racquetball Federation is a member of IRF and PARC may enter athletes in the Racquetball competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of SIXTY (60) competitors.

Each country is entitled to register a maximum of eight (8) competitors; four (4) men and four (4) women, according to the qualification criteria established by PARC.

Each country will be able to register a maximum of two (2) athletes in each individual event and a maximum of one (1) team, composed of two (2) athletes, in each of the doubles events, according to the qualification criteria established by PARC.

### c) Events:

- Women Singles
- Men Singles
- Women Doubles
- Men Doubles

### d) Qualification System

The IV Qualifying Championship for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will be held in Managua, Nicaragua from April 15 to 23, 2011. The Qualifying Championship is per country and it is mandatory to present a complete team with men and women.

The qualification will be separate for men and women and a chart will be followed which specifies the slots that each NOC is entitled to according to its result in the Qualifying Championship. This chart will be public on August 14, 2010, after the 2010 Pan American Racquetball Congress.

### e) Qualification System Approval

The system was revised and approved by PARC on May 15, 2010.



## 22. Roller Skating

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Roller Skating Federation is a member of the International Roller Sport Federation (FIRS *Federación Internacional de Roller Sports*) and PCRS may enter competitors in the Roller Skating competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of SIXTY (60) competitors, forty (40) for Sprint skating and twenty (20) for Artistic roller skating.

Each NOC will be entitled to enter a maximum of one (1) competitor in any of the events provided he or she has qualified in accordance with PCRS requirements.

Each NOC may register a maximum of four (4) athletes in sprint skating (2 male and 2 female) and two (2) athletes in artistic roller skating (1 male and 1 female), total six (6), provided they have qualified in accordance with PCRS requirements.

### d) Qualification System

- Mexico as the host country will automatically be entitled to entries in every event.
- All other entries must qualify through the 2011 Pan American Championships to be held in Rosario, Argentina on March 8-13, 2010.
- The top nine (9) countries in Speed skating and Artistic Roller skating will qualify according the CPRS points system which will be distributed in the 2010 Pan American Championship invitation.
- Therefore each event will have ten (10) competitors from ten (10) different countries.

### e) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by PCRS on May 28, 2010.



## 23. Rowing

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Rowing Federation is a member of the International Federation of Rowing Associations (FISA, *Fédération Internationale des Sociétés d'Aviron*) and the Pan American Rowing Confederation (COPARE, Confederación Panamericana de Remo) may enter competitors in the Rowing Competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of TWO HUNDRED (200) male and female competitors.

Each qualified country may enter a maximum of thirty-three (33) rowers provided they have qualified in accordance with the FISA and COPARE requirements.

### c) Qualification System

- As the host country, Mexico will automatically qualify for all events with a complete team of thirty-three (33) competitors.
- FISA and COPARE will be responsible for establishing the qualification criteria for the remaining one hundred and eighty seven (187) slots available.
- The deadline for each eligible NOC to submit to FISA and COPARE a list with the number of boats and rowers to be considered for entry in the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 is March 1, 2011.
- Should the number of requests exceed the quota of two hundred (200) athletes established by PASO (host country included), FISA and COPARE will be responsible for selecting the number of rowers per NOC to be entered in the Rowing competition of the XVI Pan American Games.
- FISA and COPARE must submit the revised list to NOCs and COPAG by July 1, 2011, in order to enable NOCs to submit the entry by number form to COPAG before the July 14, 2011 deadline.

### d) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system is subject to final approval by COPARE.



## 24. Rugby 7

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Rugby Federation is a member of IRB, NACRA and the South American Rugby Confederation (CONSUR, *Confederación Sudamericana de Rugby*) may enter athletes in the Rugby Competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum number of NINETY SIX (96) men in eight (8) teams with twelve (12) competitors each.

Each NOC may enter a maximum of one (1) team provided the teams have qualified in accordance with IRB, NACRA and CONSUR requirements.

### c) Qualification System

Considering America has two regional bodies (NACRA and CONSUR):

Substitute teams will be determined by the IRB Regions (NACRA and CONSUR) based on performance, as follows:

NACRA: at the NACRA Sevens Tournament.

CONSUR: at the CONSUR Sevens Tournament.

### d) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by the IRB, NACRA and CONSUR on February 26, 2010.



## 25. Sailing

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Sailing Federation is a member of ISAF and PASAF may enter athletes in the Sailing competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of Competitors

Competitors must be fifteen (15) years old (minimum age) on the year of the competition.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY (140) athletes male and female.

### d) Qualification System

#### Entry Quotas

- A Member National Sailing Authority (MNA) may have no more than one (1) entry in each of the nine (9) events. Qualification procedures and rulings will be the responsibility of the PASAF Qualification Committee composed of two members of the PASAF Executive Committee, the ISAF Technical Delegate and the host director of Sailing competition of Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.
- A commitment to participate from NOC must be submitted in writing and delivered to PASAF and the host country not later than July 14, 2011.
- The maximum number of MNA entries (entry quota) for each event is as follows:

- The number of athletes from the host MNA is sixteen (16) and one hundred and twenty-four (124) from the other PASAF member MNA's.



- The Qualification Committee may modify the events and/or number of athletes in an individual event after the last valid qualifying event, provided that the total number of one hundred and forty (140) athletes is not exceeded. The purpose for doing so will be solely to achieve the quota allowed.

### **MNA Qualification**

- The host MNA automatically qualifies for one entry for each of the nine events.
- Other MNA's who have respective national authorities in good standing with PASAF at the time of the qualifying event may qualify for one entry (of their choice) in that event.
- Any unclaimed qualification position will form a pool of available entry positions. The Qualification Committee will administer the pool. Positions will be attributed as follows:
  - The first priority shall be given to MNA's for one event in which they have won a Gold Medal in the same event at the immediately preceding Regional Games.
  - Any remaining entries shall be assigned taking into consideration Regional Games results, the ISAF World Ranking List (if applicable), overall Pan American Qualification results and continental balance, not necessarily in this order.
  - Within the pool, event quotas may be re-assigned among events, as the Qualification Committee may deem appropriate.

### **Events**

Bearing in mind the possibility that a chosen event might not be a valid event, the following will apply.

- a) In case a Qualification Event is invalid, then the slots will be split among the valid events for that class in the proportion decided by the Qualification Committee.
- b) In the highly unlikely situation that all Qualification Events were invalid, the Qualification Committee will be in charge of assigning all of the slots.

Competitors from a minimum of three (3) countries must compete in one event for it to be a valid Qualification Event.

Regardless of the number of slots, the Qualification Committee will be in charge of the distribution, taking into consideration the results of all the other major class events which took place during the three (3) years immediately prior to the Pan American Games with emphasis on the preceding eighteen (18) months.

- If an event is cancelled, is not held, or fails to attract competitors from at least one more country than can qualify at that event, the Qualification Committee may select an alternate event or events while striving to maintain continental balance.
- In addition to the number of countries to be qualified, an "alternate" or backup country will be selected at the last qualification event in each class. The "alternate" country will replace any qualified country that does not send a competitor to the Games.
- Dates and locations of events will be updated as they become known and circulated in revisions of this document.

#### e) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by PASAF on November 11, 2009.



## 26. Shooting

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO and whose National Shooting Federation is a member of ISSF and the American Shooting Confederation (CAT, *Confederación Americana de Tiro*) may enter competitors in the Shooting competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY (250) competitors (male/female).

- **Skeet**

For each men's or women's skeet events, any NOC may enter a maximum of two (2) athletes.

For each men's skeet events (skeet, trap and double trap), any NOC may enter a maximum of six (6) athletes meaning (2) competitors per event.

For the two women's skeet events (skeet, trap), any NOC may enter a maximum of three (3) athletes, meaning two (2) competitors in one event and one (1) competitor in the other event.

Non-starting alternates will not be accredited. To be accredited, a participant must be entered in an event.

- **Pistol**

For each men's or women's pistol events, any NOC may enter a maximum of two (2) athletes.

For the men's pistol events (10m Air Pistol, 25m Rapid Fire Pistol, 50m Pistol), any NOC may enter a maximum of five (5) athletes, which means, two (2) competitors in one event, two (2) competitors in another event and one (1) competitor in the third event.

For the two women's pistol events (10m Air Pistol, 25m Pistol), any NOC may enter a maximum of three (3) athletes, meaning two (2) competitors in one event and one (1) competitor in the other event.

Non-starting alternates will not be accredited. To be accredited, a participant must be entered in an event.

- **Rifle**

For the men's or women's rifle events, any NOC may enter a maximum of two (2) athletes.



For the men's rifle events (50m 3 Positions, 50m Prone, 10m Air), any NOC may enter a maximum of five (5) athletes, which means, two (2) competitors in one event, two (2) competitors in another event and one (1) competitor in the third event.

For the women's rifle events, (50m 3 Positions, 10m Air) any NOC may enter a maximum of three (3) athletes, which means, two (2) competitors in one event and one (1) competitor in another event.

Non-starting alternates will not be accredited. To be accredited, a participant must be entered in an event.

### c) Qualification System

- Mexico as host country is automatically qualified in every category of the Shooting Competition at the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.
- NOCs will only be able to register competitors that were qualified according to the system established by CAT.
- No later than **July 1th, 2011**, each eligible NOC shall submit to the American Shooting Federation (CAT) a list of shooters to be considered in the Entry by Name in the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011. Should the number of requests exceed the quota of 250 shooters, CAT will select the shooters to be entered in the XVI Pan American Games and will duly inform NOCs, PASO Technical Commission and COPAG.
- A maximum of twenty five (25) athletes may be entered by each NOC in all sports shooting events (pistol, skeet, rifle and trap). Each NOC, with a National Shooting Federation affiliated to ISSF and CAT, will be assigned by CAT allocations for the maximum number of athletes it may enter in all shooting sports (pistol, skeet, rifle and trap) no later than **July 15, 2011** so that the Nominal and Numerical Entry processes can be made according to the Pan American Games regulations.
- The number of athlete allocations to be assigned to each NOC will be based on the historic participation in Pan American Games and on the participation of the country's National Shooting Federation in regional, continental and world level international shooting competitions since the XIII Pan American Games Winnipeg 1999.

### d) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved CAT on May 27, 2010.

### e) London 2012 Olympic Qualification

The Shooting competition during the XVI Pan American Games will be a qualifying Competition for the London 2012 Olympic Games. During the competition, fifteen (15) places will be distributed as follows:

In addition, the Shooting competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will be a qualification competition for the London 2012 Olympic Games for the athletes that obtain the MQS (Minimum Qualification Score) status for participating athletes.



## 27. Softball

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO whose National Softball Federation is a member of ISF and the Pan American Amateur Softball Confederation (CONPASA, *Confederación Panamericana de Softbol Amateur*) may enter athletes in the Softball Competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

The duties of CONPASA Officials, Delegates, and those of the Members of the Organizing Committee are incompatible with those of players, managers, coaches or with anyone related to the team. Also, managers and coaches cannot be players, unless they are entered among the seventeen (17) registered athletes.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTY SIX (**136**) female competitors in eight (8) teams.

Each NOC may enter a maximum of one team with seventeen (17) competitors provided they have qualified in accordance with CONPASA requirements

### c) Qualification System

Mexico, as the host country will qualify with one team to participate in the Softball Competition.

2009 Pan American Softball Championship for Women held in Aragua, Venezuela from July 31 to August 9, 2009, was the qualifier event to XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011, qualifying the top seven countries in the tournament.

## 28. Squash

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO whose National Squash Federation is a member of WSF and the Pan American Squash Federation (FPS, *Federación Panamericana de Squash*) may enter athletes in the Squash competition at the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of SIXTY (60) competitors from both genders.

Each NOC will be entitled to enter a maximum of two (2) players in individual events, one (1) couple in doubles and one (1) team by country, provided they have qualified in accordance with FPS requirements.

Maximum participation by NOC: three (3) by gender.

### c) Events

Individual, doubles and teams, male and female.

### d) Qualification System

The qualification to XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 shall be based on the results of the 2010 Pan American Championship to be held in Guatemala, Guatemala on November 2010.

## 29. Table Tennis

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO whose National Table Tennis Federation is a member of ITTF, LATTU and NATTU may enter athletes in the Table Tennis competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, the maximum number of athletes is EIGHTY (80), forty (40) women and forty (40) men.

Each NOC will be entitled to enter a maximum of six (6) athletes, three (3) men and three (3) women.

### c) Qualification System

NOCs will only be allowed to enter athletes who have qualified through the qualification system established by ITTF, LATTU and NATTU, as described below:

- **Host country:** Mexico is automatically qualified with a complete team, three (3) men and three (3) women for all table tennis events.
- **ITTF Ranking:** the three (3) best ranked teams of the Americas according to the ITTF Team Computer Ranking in force on January 1st, 2011 will be qualified;
- **South America:** the top two (2) teams from South America according to results from the **Latin America Qualification Event** to be held on March, 2011 in Guadalajara, Mexico.
- **Central America:** the top two (2) teams from Central America according to results from the **Latin America Qualification Event** to be held on March, 2011 in Guadalajara, Mexico.
- **Caribbean:** the top two (2) teams from the Caribbean region, according to results from the **Latin America Qualification Event** to be held on March, 2011 in Guadalajara, Mexico.
- **Special Qualification:** the top two (2) teams from any region in the Americas not already qualified.
- Countries that have not qualified, including those affiliated to NATTU, will be allowed to take part of a **Special Qualification Event**. This Special Qualification Event will be staged in the same city and right after the Latin America Qualification Event, and will qualify two (2) men's teams, two (2) women's teams, four (4) men's individual and four (4) women's individual, in order to complete the athletes' quota established by PASO.

#### e) 2012 London Olympic Qualification

The Table Tennis competition during the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will be a Qualifying Competition for the 2012 London Olympic Games.

The gold medalist, men and women, in the individual events, will qualify directly for the Table Tennis Competition in the 2012 London Olympic Games. The qualification will apply to the athlete individually.



## 30. Taekwondo

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO whose National Taekwondo Federation is a member of WTF and PATU may register athletes in the Taekwondo competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of Competitors

Competitors must be fifteen (15) years old (minimum) and thirty-five (35) years old (maximum) on January 1, 2011.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of ONE HUNDRED AND EIGHT (**108**) athletes, fifty-six (56) male and fifty-two (52) female.

Each country may enter a maximum of eight (8) athletes, four (4) men and four (4) women, provided they have qualified in accordance with PATU requirements.

No country may transfer their automatic slot to another PATU member country. Any slot not covered by the original recipient country will be returned to the wildcard pool and allocated by the PATU Executive Committee, in agreement with PASO.

No later than February 1, 2011, National Taekwondo Federation/Association from each participating PATU country must submit a written report to PATU listing the names of their athletes to be entered in Taekwondo competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### e) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by PATU on December 16, 2009.



## 31. Tennis

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO whose National Tennis Federation is a member of ITF and the Pan American Tennis Confederation (CPT, *Confederación Panamericana de Tenis*) may enter athletes in the Tennis competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of competitors

Competitors must be fourteen (14) years old (minimum) on the date of the first competition day.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of EIGHTY (80) athletes, men and women.

Each country may enter a maximum of six (6) athletes, three (3) men and three (3) women.

In the singles draw, there will be no more than three (3) players per country.  
In the doubles draw, there will be no more than one (1) couple per country.

### d) Qualification System

- As host country, Mexico is automatically qualified for all events with a complete team.
- 64 slots will be covered with the athletes registered by each country, prioritizing those which are best placed in the ATP/WTA ranking list in force on Monday August 29, 2011.
- There will be ten (10) Wild Card (6 per Men and 4 per Women), and will be distributed by the CPT.
- After the allocation based on the ranking has been made and if there still were slots and athletes without ranking, PCT will incorporate athletes based on other events results.

### e) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by CPT on August 31, 2009.



**f) London 2012 Olympic Qualification**

The Tennis competition of the XVI Pan American Games will be part of the qualification criteria for the London 2012 Olympic Games, as stated below:

The Gold Medalists (men and women) in the Tennis Competition at the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will have priority entry to the Olympic 2012 Tennis Event, after the direct acceptances and under the following two criteria:

- The athlete must have a ranking on the inscription deadline close enough to the ranking of the last direct acceptance (in Athens and Beijing: The ranking with which the direct acceptances were closed was in the range of 80).
- The athlete must represent a country that has not reached the maximum number of four acceptances on the singles list according to the qualification system.



## 32. Triathlon

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO whose National Triathlon Federation is a member of ITU and PATCO may enter athletes in the Triathlon competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum number of competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, the maximum number who may compete is SEVENTY (70) athletes, forty (40) men and thirty (30) women.

### c) Qualification System

#### NOC Quota

- The earned slots belong to the NOC.
- The slots are not assigned individually to the athlete who has earned it.
- Each NOC has the right to register a maximum of six (6) athletes: three (3) men and three (3) women.
- NOCs will be attributed qualification places and will select from eligible athletes to fill these places (qualification system listed below).
- Athletes may not qualify for their NOC for more than one (1) qualification slot.

#### Places Assignment

##### 1) Places obtained in qualifying competitions

- Places 1 and 2 for Men and Women  
1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places in the Triathlon competition of XXI Central American and Caribbean Games 2010, to be held in Mayaguez, Puerto Rico, on July 23 and 24, 2010.
- Places 3 and 4 for Men and Women  
1st and 2nd places in the Triathlon competition of IX South American Games (ODESUR Games) held in Medellin, Colombia, on March 26, 2011.
- Place 5 for Men and Women  
1<sup>st</sup> place in South American Triathlon Championship, 2011 (place and date to be defined).
- Place 6 for Men and Women  
1st place in Central American and Caribbean Triathlon Championship, 2011 (place and date to be defined).

##### 2) Slots from the ITU Ranking In Force on June 30, 2011

- Places from 7 to 16 for Men - Places from 7 to 13 for Women  
These places will be assigned to the NOCs, following the highest positions, taking into account from the 1 to the 55 position of the ITU World Ranking.

In case a NOC is allocated with 3 places, it will not be allowed another place and this place will be attributed to the next NOC in descending order.



Should the 55 position be reached without completing the places, the remaining places will be assigned according to the Americas Ranking. (PATCO)

### 3) Slots from the PATCO Ranking in force on June 30, 2010.

- Places from 17 to 33 for Men – Places from 14 to 23 for Women  
These places will be assigned to the NOCs, following the highest positions, taking into account from the 1 to the 125 position of the PATCO Ranking.

In case a NOC is allocated with 3 places, it will not be allowed another place and this place will be attributed to the next NOC in descending order.

Should the 125 position be reached without completing the places, the remaining places will be assigned by invitation from PATCO.

### 4) Slots per Host Country (México)

- Places from 34 to 36 for Men – Places from 24 to 26 for Women  
These places will be assigned to the Host Country

If Mexico obtains slots in any of the above mentioned allocations, these slots will be assigned by:

- ITU Ranking in Force on June 30, 2011 from the last position used on item 2) until the 125 position. If reached the 125 position the slots have not yet been completed, these will be assigned according to the Americas Ranking (PATCO).
- PATCO Ranking in force on June 30, 2010 from the last position used on item 3) until the 125 position. If reached the 125 position the slots have not yet been completed, these will be assigned by invitation from the Pan American Triathlon Confederation.

### 5) Invitation Slots

- Places from 37 to 40 for Men – Places from 27 to 30 for Women  
These will be assigned by invitation according to the PATCO.

### 6) Entry deadline

The deadline for submitting the individual Numerical Entry forms, without specifying names, but indicating the number of participants per event to COPAG is **Thursday, July 14, 2011** at midnight (Mexico time).

The qualification system was revised and approved by PATCO on May 25, 2010.

#### **e) 2012 London Olympic Qualification**

The XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will be considered a Triathlon qualification competition for the London 2012 Olympic Games.

The Gold Medalist, male and female, will qualify directly for the London 2012 Olympic Games.

The XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will be considered the Pan American Triathlon Championships 2011 and it will add points to the World Ranking (ITU) and the Pan American Ranking (PATCO).

## 33. Volleyball

### 33.1 Beach Volleyball

#### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO whose National Volleyball Federation is a member of the International Volleyball Federation (FIVB, *Fédération Internationale de Volleyball*) and Pan American Volleyball Union (UPV, *Unión Panamericana de Voleibol*) may register athletes in the Beach Volleyball competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

#### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, the maximum number of competitors in the Beach Volleyball competition will be SIXTY FOUR (64), thirty-two (32) men and thirty-two (32) women.

There will be a maximum of sixteen (16) men's teams and sixteen (16) women's teams with a maximum of two (2) men and two (2) women per team.

Each NOC will be allowed to enter only one (1) team per gender, provided they have qualified in accordance with UPV requirements.

#### c) Qualification System

- Mexico, as the host country, will automatically qualify with one team for each gender.
- The top ten (10) countries in the NORCECA Tour until **June 30, 2011**, not including the host country.
- The top five (5) countries in South America's ranking until **June 30, 2011**.

#### d) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by UPV on November 4, 2009.



## 33.2 Volleyball

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO whose National Volleyball Federation is a member of the International Volleyball Federation (FIVB, *Fédération Internationale de Volleyball*) and Pan American Volleyball Union (UPV, *Unión Panamericana de Voleibol*) may register athletes in the Volleyball competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will a maximum of ONE HUNDRED AND NINETY TWO (**192**) athletes, eight (8) teams for each gender and a maximum of twelve (12) competitors per team.

Each NOC may enter a maximum of one team in each event provided they have qualified in accordance with UPV requirements.

### c) Qualification System

- Mexico, as the host country, will automatically qualify with one team for each gender.
- The remaining teams will be the top seven countries in the Americas according to the FIVB ranking of each gender until **January 1, 2011**, not including the host country.

### d) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by UPV on November 4, 2009.



## 34. Water Ski

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO whose National Water Ski Federation is a member of IWSF and PWSC may enter athletes in the Water Ski competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of FORTY (40) male and female competitors with thirty-two (32) skiers and eight (8) wakeboard male riders.

Each NOC will be allowed to enter a maximum of two (2) athletes per event and per gender.

Athletes can be registered in more than one (1) event or in all events.

### c) Qualification System

The qualification event for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011 will be the Pan American Water Ski Championship to be held in Santiago, Chile, November 2010, ranking each country's team performance. The qualifications will be as follows:

- As the host country, Mexico will be automatically qualified for all events in the Water Ski Competition at the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011, to a maximum of four (4) water ski athletes and one (1) wakeboard athlete. Total of five (5) athletes.
- The top seven countries of this Championship will be allowed to register for the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011, according to the following:
  - Maximum three (3) athletes of one gender.
  - 1<sup>st</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> a maximum of four (4) water ski athletes plus one(1) male wakeboard rider each, for a total of thirty five (35) athletes.
  - Other countries may field a team of two (2), with no more than one (1) athlete per gender, and one (1) wakeboard rider.

### d) Qualification System Approval

The qualification system was revised and approved by PWSC on May 25, 2010.



## 35. Weightlifting

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO whose National Weightlifting Federation is a member of IWF and PWF may enter athletes in the Weightlifting competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Age of Competitors

Competitors must be at least sixteen (16) years old on the year of the competition.

### c) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY FIVE (**125**) competitors, sixty-nine (**69**) men and fifty-six (**56**) women.

The maximum number of athletes any NOC may enter in the competition is seven (7) men and six (6) women provided he/she has qualified in accordance with IWF and PWF requirements.

### d) Qualification System

#### A.- Men's Qualification System

##### 1. Main Qualifying events: 2009 and 2010 Pan American Championships.

- XX Pan American Championship 2009 held in Chicago, Illinois from June 2 to June 8, 2009.
- XXI Pan American Championship 2010 held in Guatemala, Guatemala from May 26 to May 30, 2010.

When two (2) or more teams have the same points and places in total, the points according to the IWF 5.8.3 and 5.8.7 Technical Rules for Snatch and Clean & Jerk will be calculated and considered to determine the final qualification in case of a tie.

## 2. Host Country

The host country will automatically qualify seven (7) places for men. The points/rank achieved by the teams of the host country at the main qualification events will not count and the NOC will move up to take the host country places.

When two (2) or more teams have the same points and places in total, the points according to the IWF 5.8.3 and 5.8.7 Technical Rules for Snatch and Clean & Jerk will be calculated and considered to determine the final qualification in case of a tie.

## 2. Host Country

The host country will automatically qualify six (6) places for women. The points/rank achieved by the teams of the host country at the main qualification events will not count and the NOC will move up to take the host country places.



### **C.- Wild Card**

The Executive Committee based on the petitions submitted by the NOCs and in consultation with PASO, can assign a total of four (4) wild cards to the NOCs in a 2 men and 2 women distribution. The NOCs must submit their petitions for places to the Executive Committee Invitation Commission no later than July 1, 2011, copying PWF, before this deadline.

The Executive Committee will inform the NOCs of the allocation of invitational places before July 14, 2011 so they can make the registration process according to the Pan American Games Regulation.

### **e) Qualification System Approval**

The qualification system was revised and approved by PWF on February 15, 2009.



## 36. Wrestling

### a) Participation

Only NOCs recognized by PASO whose National Wrestling Federation is a member of the International Wrestling Federation (FILA, *Fédération Internationale des Luttes Associées*) and the Pan American Wrestling Committee (CPLA, *Consejo Panamericano de Luchas Asociadas*) may enter athletes in the Wrestling competition of the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011.

### b) Maximum Number of Competitors

According to the quota established by PASO, there will be a maximum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY (150) competitors, male y female.

Each NOC may enter a maximum of one (1) competitor in each event provided he/she has qualified in accordance with FILA and CPLA requirements.

### c) Qualification System

- As host country, Mexico will automatically qualify to compete in the eighteen (18) events of the Wrestling competition in the XVI Pan American Games Guadalajara 2011; nevertheless, Mexico has the requirement to participate with the entire team in the qualifying championship.
- The qualifying championship will be the 2011 Senior Pan American Championship to be held in place and date to be defined, in which the first 8 places will qualify. In case an athlete from Mexico is eliminated, he/she will occupy the place of the wrestler who gets the 8<sup>th</sup> place.
